

ORDINANCE NO. 44-57

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CURFEW HOURS FOR MINOR CHILDREN IN GROVE CITY, OHIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF GROVE CITY,

OHIO:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of twelve years to loiter, idle, wander, stroll, or play in or upon the public streets, highways, roads, alleys, parks, playgrounds, or other public grounds, public places and public buildings, places of amusement and entertainment, vacant lots or other unsupervised places during the period from darkness to dawn; provided, however, that the provisions of this paragraph do not apply to a minor accompanied by his or her parent, guardian or other adult person having the care of and custody of the minor, or where the minor is upon an emergency errand or legitimate business directed by his or her parent, guardian, or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor.

It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of eighteen years to loiter, idle, wander, stroll, or play in or upon the public streets, highways, roads, alleys, parks, playgrounds, or other public grounds, public places and public buildings, places of amusement and entertainment, vacant lots or other unsupervised places, between the hours of 11:00 P.M. and 4:30 A.M. Eastern Standard Time, of the following day, provided, however, that the provisions of this paragraph do not apply to a minor accompanied by his or her parent, guardian, or other adult person having the care of and custody of the minor, or where the minor is upon an emergency errand or legitimate business directed by his or her parent, guardian, or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor.

The parent, guardian or person having the legal custody and control of any minor violating any of the provisions hereof shall be deemed guilty of a

misdemeanor. Upon the first violation of the provisions of this section, the parent or legal guardian of the minor shall be fined any sum not to exceed \$50, or imprisoned not to exceed 30 days, or both. Upon the second or subsequent violation of this section the parent or legal guardian of the minor shall be fined in a sum not to exceed \$100, or imprisoned not to exceed 60 days or both.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**ORDINANCE NO. 44-57**  
**An Ordinance Establishing Curfew Hours for Minor Children in Grove City, Ohio:**  
 Be It Ordained by the Council of the Village of Grove City, Ohio:

**Section 1.** It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of twelve years to loiter, idle, wander, stroll, or play in or upon the public streets, highways, roads, alleys, parks, playgrounds, or other public grounds, public places and public buildings, places of amusement and entertainment, vacant lots or other unsupervised places during the period from darkness to dawn; provided, however, that the provisions of this paragraph do not apply to a minor accompanied by his or her parent, guardian or other adult person having the care of and custody of the minor, or where the minor is upon an emergency errand or legitimate business directed by his or her parent, guardian, or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor.
